Day 1 Wednesday

- 12: 00 Noon Arrive in Berea, Kentucky's "Folk Arts and Crafts Capital," for lunch at Historic Boone Tavern or the Kentucky Artisan Center at Berea.
- 1:30 p.m. Tour the "new" Kentucky Artisan Center at Berea; Berea College, founded in 1855 for Appalachian Region students who could not afford a college education; Churchill Weavers, known as America's foremost hand weaving studio; and shop in some of Berea's many craft and gift shops.
- 4:30 p.m. Check into a motel of your choice in the Berea or Renfro Valley areas.
- 5:30 p.m. Sit down and relax a spell for an evening of Front Porch Pickin' at Renfro Valley Entertainment Center.
- 7:00 p.m. Dinner tonight is at The Renfro Valley Lodge Restaurant or other area restaurant of your choice.
- 9:00 p.m. Return to motel for overnight.

Day 2 Thursday

- 7:00 a.m. Breakfast this morning at a restaurant of your choice.
- 8:00 a.m. Start the day with a visit to our newest attraction, The Kentucky Music Hall of Fame and Museum, and become acquainted with some of our world-famous entertainers such as Loretta Lynn, Rosemary Clooney, Bill Monroe, and the Everly Brothers.
- 9:30 a.m. Depart for the community of Hindman.
- 11:30 a.m. Optional lunch at Hindman Settlement School, founded in 1902 to provide a variety of community and educational services, followed by a tour of this facility, the Appalachian Artisan Center, and the Kentucky School of Craft.
- 3:00 p.m. Depart for Paintsville.
- 4:00 p.m. Check into a Paintsville motel of your choice.
- 5:30 p.m. You are in for a "Hawaiian" treat for dinner tonight at the Ramada Inn.

- 7:00 p.m. Depart for Jenny Wiley State Resort Park, located on the 1,000-acre Lake Dewey and the home of Jenny Wiley Theatre.
- 8:00 p.m. View one of four Broadway style productions at Jenny Wiley Theatre, one of the nation's leading repertory amphitheatres.
- 11:00 p.m. Return to Paintsville for overnight.

Day 3 Friday

- 7:00 a.m. Breakfast at a restaurant of your choice.
- 8:00 a.m. This morning begins with a driving tour of the Paintsville area to include a visit to Van Lear for a tour of Loretta Lynn's childhood home with her brother Herman Webb, the Mayo Mansion and Mayo Methodist Church, built by eastern Kentucky's first coal baron John C.C. Mayo, and featuring an organ donated by Andrew Carnegie; and the Mountain Homeplace, a living history village depicting the rugged life in the mid 1800s.
- 11:30 a.m. Enjoy a traditional Appalachian meal served at the Mountain Homeplace or depart for Prestonsburg for a luncheon matinee performance by the Jenny Wiley Theatre players in the air-conditioned Wilkinson-Stumbo Convention Center.
- 4:00 p.m. Check into a Prestonsburg motel.
- 6:00 p.m. Dinner at a Prestonsburg area restaurant of your choice.
- 8:00 p.m. Attend a performance by one of Kentucky's country music headliners at the Mountain Arts Center.
- 10:30 p.m. Return to area motel for overnight.
